SERVICE PROVIDER: Adventure Child Development

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Childcare will be provided to Weld Project Connect guests that have children aged 3 to 10 years.

RESTRICTIONS: For children aged 3 to 10 years.

#2 Veterans Services

QUESTION: *Where you ever a member of the U.S. Armed Services and find yourself in need of Veteran's Services today?*

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Veterans Services Office

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Weld County Veterans Services (WCVS) Office is in place to assist Weld County Veterans and their family members. At Weld Project Connect, you will start with the WCVS office. There, you will take a quick survey on your specific veteran service needs and be directed to receive assistance.

Veterans Survey Questions Asked When Visiting Veterans Services

2a. **QUESTION:** Do you need toothpaste, soap, combs, or other hygiene items?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County RSVP volunteers

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Free toiletries, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, combs, and a variety of hygiene items. These items will be given out to any veteran whom may need them. RSVP of Weld County is a National Service Organization that has 55 and older adults to meet community needs. We are sponsored by the University of Northern Colorado and have 800 volunteers working in 83 agencies throughout Weld County.

2b. QUESTION: Did you serve at least one day active duty and have a discharge status other than dishonorable?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Homes for All Veterans

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Free hand sanitizers, Hygiene kits (female and male), pens and tote bags.

HAV provides a wide range of supportive services designed to promote housing stability and alleviate chronic homelessness in U.S. military veterans who have served at least 1 day active duty, who are considered low income, and who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless are generally considered eligible. Veterans must not have been dishonorably discharged. Once approved for services, HAV Veteran Support Specialists (VSS) work with the Veteran to provide individualized case management to assist with obtaining and maintaining permanent housing through the Housing First philosophy. HAV is not a housing voucher program; therefore, the Veteran must work toward increasing income and/or other financial means to sustain ongoing monthly rent payments, along with their other bills and payment obligations.

Intake Processing Checklist:

- Proof of Veteran Status – Example: copy of DD-214, VHA Veterans ID card, HINQS, VISTA form
- Proof of Income Status – Example: attached Income Affidavit – one for each person over 18 in the household. (Supporting documentation for income, including most recent bank and savings statements, and all sources of income.)
- Proof of Current Living Situation – Example: SSVF Homeless Certification form, letter from shelter, or demand of payment/eviction notice.



2c. QUESTION: Are you experiencing homelessness and need housing assistance, substance abuse treatment, or employment assistance?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Veterans Administration

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Cheyenne Veterans Administration Homeless Program provides services to Veterans experiencing homelessness in Northern Colorado and Southwestern Wyoming through a Veteran Housing Voucher program, the Emergency Contract Shelter programs, and the Grant and Per Diem programs. Veterans are also assisted with accessing additional Veterans Administration and non-Veterans Administration Services such as substance abuse treatment (inpatient and outpatient), medical services, mental health services, employment assistance services, Supportive Services for Veteran Family housing stability referrals, and Veterans Benefits Administration. Each program has different eligibility requirements, which is determined through the intake process either on-site or by appointment. We can assist with the enrollment process for VA healthcare services on-site as well. We also provide resources for the Veterans Crisis Line in the form of but not limited to wallet cards, dog tags, bracelets, coasters, and bandannas

2d. QUESTION: Would you like to talk with someone about combat or other traumas experienced in your military service?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Fort Collins Veterans Center

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Vet Centers were established in 1979 to help our returning Veterans reconnect and readjust back into civilian life. We understand the difficulties and issues that these Veterans may be facing, as many of our counselors and staff are Veterans themselves. Vet Centers are staffed by small multi-disciplinary teams of dedicated providers, who strive to help the returning Veteran and their families make a successful transition into civilian life. Specifically, we provide individual and group counseling for active duty, Veterans, and their family members. We also provide sexual trauma and harassment counseling to Veterans of both sexes, all eras, regardless of service in a combat theater. We can provide referral services for substance abuse issues.

The services provided to eligible veterans and their families by the Vet Centers are pre-paid by the veteran's honorable service to their country and a grateful nation. There are no copayments or other fiscal obligations. Veterans are asked to bring a copy of their DD-214 in order to confirm eligibility. Ultimately, our goal is to keep the promise that was made to all Veterans that they will be taken care of when they return home.

2e. QUESTION: Are you a retired Veteran, spouse, or surviving spouse aged 65 years or older who could use help around the house at no cost?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Veterans Aide at Home, LLC

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Veterans Aide at Home, LLC is a non-medical home care agency dedicated to Veterans, their spouses, or surviving spouses. Our services COST NOTHING to those who qualify for VA benefits. To be eligible for FREE care, the following criteria must be met:

- The Veteran must have been Honorably discharged from service.
- The Veteran must have served at least 90 days on active duty with at least one day during wartime.
- The Veteran or surviving spouse must be 65 years of age or older.
- The Veteran or surviving spouse must have limited income and assets (including home and vehicle).
- The Veteran, spouse, or surviving spouse must have a condition causing them to need assistance with activities of daily living.

At Weld Project Connect, we can evaluate whether you qualify for benefits under this program and assist you with completing the application. For Veterans, spouses, or surviving spouses who do not qualify due to income and assets being too high, we can provide options for discounted rates for services as well.

2f. QUESTION: Were you honorably discharged, served on active duty in the last 15 years, and want educational assistance?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Aims Community College Veterans Services

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Aims Community College will be able to provide documents verifying eligibility for VA Education Benefits (GI Bill) if the veteran or dependent has applied. If the veteran or their dependent has not applied, assistance with the application process will be provided.

2g. QUESTION: Are you in need of housing stability or landlord negotiation assistance?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Volunteers of America Back Home Program

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Back Home-SSVF program provides intensive case management around housing stability, including veteran's benefit, public benefits, and budgeting to veterans that are currently homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. At Weld Project Connect we will be doing screenings as well as intakes for low income eligible veterans. We will be able to provide veteran-specific information and resources as well as referrals to relevant sources. The take-away items that we will include, but are not limited to, are veteran-specific benefits, crisis intervention cards, and a housing stability benefits packet that will include helpful information and FAQs about housing and the process of gaining housing. We can also assist veterans with housing search assistance as well as landlord negotiation, as needed.

2h. QUESTION: Do you need any other assistance with services?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Veterans Services Office

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Weld County Veterans Service office is in place to assist Weld County Veterans and their family members. We offer assistance with filing of Service Connected disability claims, NSC pension claims, widow's benefits, V.A. educational programs (forms & applications), survivor and burial benefits, and Colorado state veteran's benefits. We offer assistance with retrieving Veterans military service records, discharge certificates, and Service Medical Records.

When we cannot directly assist Veterans our job is to direct them to the proper channel of aid. Our office keeps confidential files for our veterans to aid in documenting all paperwork involved in the V.A. claims process. We accomplish our goals of assisting our local veterans by face to face communication in our office, over the phone, and by conducting community outreach. We work with local agencies such as the VFW, American Legion, DAV, and numerous College Veterans benefits offices.

2i. QUESTION: Are you in need of any services your U S Senator can assist with?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Senate Bennet and Gardner's Office

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Offices of Senator Bennet and Gardner often can help constituents who need assistance with a federal agency. We have assisted veterans with obtaining records, medical benefits, and disability claims; assisted constituents with Social Security and Medicare benefits; assisted constituents with visa or immigration issues; and assisted constituents who had issues with a number of federal agencies. Once we discuss your issue with you, we will determine whether we can submit an inquiry, then have you fill out a privacy release form, provide other documents to assist the inquiry, after which we send the inquiry to the federal agency.

#3 Resumes

QUESTION: Do you need help putting your resume together?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Resume Services of Weld County

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Assistance provided to help customers develop and publish resumes.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#4 Job Services

QUESTION: Do you need assistance looking for employment and are you registered with “Connecting Colorado”?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Employment Services of Weld County

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Employment Services is a Colorado Workforce Center. The main goal of the agency for job seekers is to provide appropriate services to customers that enhance opportunities in obtaining employment. Services available through the workforce Center include; job referrals, resume, interviewing job application, and transferable skills workshops, access to computers, fax, copiers, and phones for job seeking purposes.

Employment Services staff will be reactivating Connecting Colorado registrations, providing job referrals, and information on additional services that can be accessed through the agency.

If an individual is already accessing services through Employment Services, they may want to make other Project Connect Services a priority at the event.

RESTRICTIONS: Individuals must know their social security number, basic demographic information, and work history to receive services.

#5 Child Support

QUESTION: Do you need help with sending, collecting, establishing, or changing your child support payments?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Human Services (WCDHS)

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: WCDHS collects support payments from non-custodial parents and distributes them to the custodial party. We establish paternity and both create and modify support orders. To apply, you need only be the custodian of a minor child or the person paying.

RESTRICTIONS: Custodian of child or person paying child support.

#6 Assist Payments

QUESTION: Do you need to complete an application for Food Stamps, TANF, or other Assistance Programs?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Human Services (WCDHS)
Assistance Payments

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Provides public assistance to eligible individuals and families. Public assistance includes, but is not limited to: Food Assistance, Old Age Pension, Colorado Works and Low-income Child Care.

RESTRICTIONS: Individuals must provide photo ID, birth certificate, social security card, employment information, and pay stubs.

#7 Medicaid/CHP+

QUESTION: Are you pregnant and/or 0-20 years old and want to apply for or have questions regarding Medicaid or CHP+?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment (WCDPHE)

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Healthy Communities Program provides application assistance to pregnant women and families who may be eligible for Medicaid and/or CHP+. The program also assists those already receiving Medicaid and/or CHP+ in understanding their benefits and accessing medical, dental, vision, mental health, and specialty services. We help pregnant women find providers for the prenatal care, helping to ensure a healthy pregnancy and a healthy baby. We encourage parents to take advantage of the preventative health care benefits for their children and help them find providers for those services.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#8 Birth Certificates

QUESTION: Are you over 18, born in Colorado, and need a copy of your birth certificate?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment (WCDPHE)

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: To provide, free, on-site birth certificate issuance to eligible attendees who are 18 years of age or older, state law requires that an application must be completed and applicant must submit proof of identity in order to be eligible to receive a copy of their birth certificate. The most common forms of proof of identity include: state driver's license/ID, foreign passport, Medicaid or Medicare card, social security card, IRS-taxpayer letter or card, Mexican voter registration card, Colorado Department of Corrections ID card, vehicle registration, most current paycheck stubs (NOTE: depending on the type of identification provided, a secondary form of identification may be required) If the attendee does not have any of these common forms of documentation to establish his or her identity, attendee may wish to stop by the Weld Project Connect/Birth Certificates booth to obtain a comprehensive list of documentation that can be used to establish identity for this purpose.

RESTRICTIONS: Individuals must be over the age of 18 years and have been born in Colorado.

#9 Voter Registration

QUESTION: Would you like to register to vote or update your voter registration?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Clerk and Recorder

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Weld County Elections office registers eligible electors to vote. To be an eligible elector, you must be 18 years of age or older at the time of the next election, be a US citizen, have resided in Colorado for 22 days immediately before the election you intend to vote in, and not serving a sentence of confinement, detention or parole for a felony conviction. In addition to registering new voters and updating voter records, we will be sharing historical data and providing information on the 2016 election. The information will be process-specific and not candidate or issue-related.

RESTRICTIONS: See above

#10 Medical Power of Attorney

QUESTION: Are you over 18, and need your Medical Durable Power of Attorney or Living Will?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Systems of Care Initiative (SOI) Sharing the Care

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Medical Durable Power of Attorney (MDPOA) is an advance directive that allows you to choose a person to speak for you when you are physically unable to let others know your healthcare wishes. Anyone age 18 and older can and should have a MDPOA. In Colorado there is no guarantee that your spouse, parent or sibling will have the permission to make medical decisions without an MDPOA. A Living Will gives your MDPOA a guideline for your medical care if you are in a terminal or persistent vegetative state and cannot let others know your healthcare wishes. Today you can complete your MDPOA and/or Living Will. Our staff is available to answer questions, notarize and witness forms.

RESTRICTIONS: Must be 18

HEALTH

#11 Women Wellness

QUESTION: Are you a woman over age 40 who has not had a mammogram in the last year?

SERVICE PROVIDER: North Colorado Medical Center (NCMC) Breast Center

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: We provide mammograms and ultra sounds to women over the age of 40, or under 40 if they have a breast problem (like a lump). They can have insurance, but if they do not, we will assist them with funding for this exam. Our program includes women who can help women in these 7 counties: Weld, Morgan, Sedgwick, Yuma, Phillips, Washington, or Logan, that meet monetary guidelines. They do not have to be documented to receive this service. They will need to have a doctor to report their exam to and we are happy to connect them with Weld County Health Department, the Sunrise Clinic, or Planned Parenthood, if they do not have a provider. Men can also receive this service if they have a problem with their breast (like a lump). This is a program that is provided by the NCMC, through generous donations in our community, including the Human Bean, Tough Enough to Wear Pink Rodeo, Dig Pink at UNC and various events held by schools in our area. These funds supplement the Women's Wellness Connection and Komen Grant funds when needed by women.

RESTRICTIONS: Must be woman aged 40 years or older, or a younger woman, or man with a breast problem (like a lump).

#12 Women Wellness

QUESTION: Are you a woman over age 40 and in need of a mammogram, Pap smear, or basic blood screenings?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment (WCDPHE)

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Women's Wellness Connection (WWC) and WISEWOMAN provide screening for breast and cervical cancer as well as diabetes and cholesterol for women over age 40, who are legal residents and meet income guidelines. Eligible women will be given an appointment at the WCDPHE to have these services provided. For women who do not meet WWC/WISEWOMAN guidelines, we have a referral network and can refer them to a provider with similar programs for women.

RESTRICTIONS: Must be a woman age 40 or older, legal resident, and meet income guidelines.

#13 TDAP Vaccine

QUESTION: Would you like a tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (TDAP) vaccination?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment (WCDPHE) Immunizations

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: At this year's event we will be administering TDAP vaccinations to a select group of individuals. Criteria questions: Are you pregnant? Are you over 19 years of age or with a guardian? Do you have any allergies to vaccines? Have you had any reactions to vaccinations in the past?

RESTRICTIONS: Must be 19 or older or with a Guardian to receive the vaccine and must not have had a tetanus shot in the last 10 years.

#14 Diabetes A1C Testing

QUESTION: Do you have a family history of diabetes and are concerned about having diabetes?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment (WCDPHE) Immunizations

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Weld County Department of Public Health will provide A1C screenings (for diabetes) and provide recommendations and referrals for follow-up.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#15 Pneumonia Vaccine

QUESTION: Are you an individual 65 years of age or older who has not had a pneumonia vaccine?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment (WCDPHE) Immunizations

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The pneumococcal conjugate vaccine, PCV13, is currently recommended for all adults 65 years or older, and people 6-64 years old. The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommends that all adults 65 years of age or older receive a dose of PCV13 followed by a dose of PPSV23 at least 1 year later. ACIP also recommends that adults 19 years of age or older with immunocompromising conditions, functional or anatomic asplenia, CSF leaks, or cochlear implants, and who have not previously received PCV13 or PPSC23, should receive a dose of PCV13.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#16 Tuberculosis Testing

QUESTION: If you have not been screened in the last year or never treated for Tuberculosis, would you like a free screening?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment (WCDPHE)

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The tuberculosis program provides for evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment for persons with active TB and their contacts. Preventive treatment is available for persons with positive TB tests. Testing, X-rays, and medications can be provided through this program. You must be a Weld County resident to qualify for services. We will be providing Tuberculosis testing.

RESTRICTIONS: Must be a resident of Weld County

#17 Hearing

QUESTION: Would you like a free screening for your hearing?

SERVICE PROVIDER: UNC Audiology Dept

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Check to see if you are within normal limits of hearing. It takes approximately five minutes to conduct each hearing screening. After the hearing screening, the consultant will review the audiogram and answer health questions. Let us keep you connected to the people and activities you love!

RESTRICTIONS: None

#18 Mental Health

QUESTION: Would you like to speak to a professional about mental health or substance use (addiction) concerns?

SERVICE PROVIDER: North Range Behavioral Health (NRBH)

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: North Range Behavioral Health professionals will provide brief, on-site counseling during Weld Project Connect 2015. Our staff is available to talk individually and confidentially with attendees age 15 and older about mental health treatment and addiction concerns. We will provide information so that attendees can enroll in services at North Range for further treatment, if appropriate.

NRBH provides comprehensive, professional mental health and addiction services to children, youth, adults, and families across a wide spectrum of needs. We serve people with insurance, Medicaid, Medicare, CHP+, those without insurance, and those who prefer to pay out-of-pocket. Most services can be provided in English and Spanish by bilingual, culturally sensitive behavioral health professionals.

North Range offers walk-in crisis intervention services at 928 12th Street in Greeley. You can also call at 970-347-2120 or call the state hotline at 844-493-TALK (8255) for help with behavioral health crisis over the phone. These services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

RESTRICTIONS: Must be 15 years of age or older

#19 Pregnancy

QUESTION: Do you have questions about personal health and need more information on pregnancy or STD's?

SERVICE PROVIDER: The Resource Center for Pregnancy and Personal Health

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The deliverable services the Resource Center will offer are pregnancy tests, prenatal vitamins, and appointments for STD testing and treatment or pregnancy options advising. There are no requirements, all ages can be seen.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#20 Prescriptions

QUESTION: Would you like to receive a free discount card to save money on prescriptions?

SERVICE PROVIDER: United Way of Weld County

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The FamilyWize Prescription Discount Card is a saving card that everyone can use to get up to 75% off of their prescriptions, with an average savings of \$23 per prescription! This card covers all FDA-approved drugs and is accepted at 60,000 pharmacies nationwide. Anyone is eligible to use the card, including those without healthcare coverage. Just take the card to local pharmacies and receive the discount! No registration, activation, or paperwork is required. If you have a mobile phone, you can also download the app, to make sure that you always have the card ready and available.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#21 Flexibility, Strength, & Balance

QUESTION: Do you want to visit with a physical therapist about increasing your flexibility, strength and/or balance or need to review medication with a licensed pharmacist?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Rehabilitation and Visiting Nurse Association

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Rehabilitation and Visiting Nurse Association will provide a free medication check to make sure your medication program is being managed appropriately and alert you to any concerns. You can also ask questions about medications you are taking or are being advised to take.

RESTRICTIONS: Need list of Medications currently taking.

#22 Health Screenings

QUESTION: Would you like your blood pressure, body mass index, and/or pulse checked or have a question for a nurse?

SERVICE PROVIDER: University of Northern Colorado

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: We will be performing blood pressure, body mass index, pulse, height and weight assessments. We generally write down the participant values within the range of what is considered normal for the participant. The participant can then take this information to the Nurse Practitioner station for consultation if they have concerns.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#23 HIV/Hepatitis C

QUESTION: Would you like to talk with someone about HIV, Hepatitis C, or risk-related experiences associated with them?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Northern Colorado AIDS Project (NCAP)

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: NCAP will be offering HIV (age 13+) and Hepatitis C (age 18+) antibody screenings to individuals who have experienced relevant risk for one or both viruses. Additionally, educational and prevention related information will be available.

RESTRICTIONS: Age 13 or older for HIV screening, age 18 or older for Hepatitis C screening

#24 Flu Shot

QUESTION: Would you like a flu shot today?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Walgreens Pharmacy

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Walgreens is providing flu shots for up to 300 individuals aged 7 years or older. This service is not available for those under the age requirement and those who are feeling or may be sick the day of services.

RESTRICTIONS: Aged 7 years or older and feeling healthy today

WELLNESS

#25 Chiropractic

QUESTION: Would you like to receive a spinal exam and/or chiropractic adjustment?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld Family Clinic of Chiropractic

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Weld Family Clinic of Chiropractic will offer free spinal exams and provide chiropractic adjustments to anyone who is interested.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#26 Foot Washing &/or Podiatrist

QUESTION: Would you like to have your feet washed and to see a podiatrist?

SERVICE PROVIDER: RISE

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Foot washing prior to seeing the podiatrist. No age requirement. Everyone is welcome regardless of if you want to see the podiatrist.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#27 Acupuncture

QUESTION: Would you like an acupuncture treatment to help with health problems or concerns?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Gary Liscum, L.Ac. and Amy Norton, L.Ac.

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: We will be providing short acupuncture treatments to adults that are able to consent to treatment by signing and completing an intake and health history form. Needles will be inserted as needed based on the location of their complaint. There will be three tables and two massage chairs used for treatment. Needle retention time will be no more than 20 minutes. We anticipate being able to treat approximately 40 patients in the time provided. Acupuncture may help with health problems from headache to hemorrhoids; it is great at promoting healing and reducing or alleviating pain. Allergies, asthma, digestive problems, colds and flu are all health problems treated by acupuncture. Acupuncture is a natural, drug free way to improve and maintain good health.

RESTRICTIONS: Must be 18 years of age or older.

#28 Tobacco

QUESTION: Do you use tobacco and are you interested in resources to help quit?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment (WCDPHE)

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Weld County Tobacco Program is interested in preventing children and teens from using cigarettes, chew, and/or e-cigarettes as well as helping tobacco users to quit. We will fill out the QuitLine's fax referral form onsite with interested individuals and fax it to the Colorado QuitLine. The QuitLine will provide those wanting to quit with free patches or gum and telephone-based counseling to increase their chances of quitting. We will also provide individuals with quit kits that contain helpful resources to assist a person on their quit journey. Quit kit resources include a tobacco-cost calculator, chewing gum or toothpicks, quit tips, and reminder cards.

RESTRICTIONS: None

#29 United Way

QUESTION: Do you need hygiene items?

SERVICE PROVIDER: United Way of Weld County

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Hygiene kits contain important items for individuals and families to meet basic needs. Sample items (each kit will have up to 6 of the items listed below):

- Bar of soap
- Bottle of shampoo (travel size)
- Bottle of conditioner (travel size)
- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste

#34 Bright by Three

QUESTION: Do you have a child prenatal to age 3 and would like books on child development, baby clothes, or diapers?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Bright by Three

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Bright by Three (formerly Bright Beginnings) provides a bright beginning for all Colorado children by helping families support their children's physical, emotional, and intellectual development during the critical first three years of life. In the first 3 years of life, 85% of a baby's intellect, personality, and social skills are developed. Parents and families are key to early childhood development but often need support to provide the right environment. The Bright by Three program addresses this critical period in children's lives by educating parents on a wide spectrum of skills necessary for raising a well-developed child. At Weld Project Connect Bright by Three will provide parents with information on brain and physical development of their children, a book for the family to read, diapers, baby clothes, and connections to other local resources for families.

#35 School District 6

SERVICE PROVIDER: Greeley-Evans School District 6

#45 City of Greeley Pet & Bicycle Licenses

SERVICE PROVIDER: City of Greeley

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: If you own a cat or dog within Greeley city limits your pet must be registered to avoid a summons to Municipal Court. #49 Greeley Municipal Court

QUESTION: Do you have an outstanding City of Greeley ticket, fines, or a warrant and want an opportunity to clear it up?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Greeley Municipal Court

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Greeley Municipal Court handles cases related to parking, traffic, animal, and misdemeanor criminal violations. When a ticket is unpaid, when a person fails to appear for his/her court date, or when court ordered programs are not completed, a case may result in suspension of one's driver's license and/or a warrant for that person's arrest. There are often circumstances that prevent a person from being able to complete obligations or pay outstanding balances owed to the court. If you have personal circumstances which you wish to discuss with the Judge without the anxiety of the courtroom setting, this service is for you. We can verify case status, balance due, set future court dates, recall warrants, and arrange alternatives to court ordered payments, such as useful public service. This is a chance to ask questions in a non-threatening, low-stress environment.

After School Programs

QUESTION: Are you need of an after school/out of school program for your school age child(ren)

SERVICE PROVIDER: Boys & Girls Club

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Boys & Girls Clubs of Weld County currently provides Youth Development programming to over 2,000 youth ages 5-18 in the communities of: Greeley, Evans, Eaton (Summer Only), Galeton, Johnstown, Milliken, Fort Lupton and the surrounding communities.

The Clubs are open M-F after school until 6PM in school-based sites and until 8PM at our Traditional Clubhouses in Greeley. The Pawl Club also has a Teen (only) Center for members ages 13+ and is on the GET bus route that can be accessed for free with School District 6 ID. The Clubs are also open M-F from 8AM-5:30PM during the Summer break and the two Greeley Clubhouses are open from 8AM-5:30 during Fall and Spring Breaks as well as most school in-service days and early release days.

Specific programs may vary by location but all Clubs have extensive programming in Academic Success, Healthy Lifestyles and Good Character & Citizenship. Two meals and a snack are served during the full days, Dinner is provided at the two Greeley Clubhouses and an after school snack is served at all Club locations in Weld County.

After School Program

QUESTION: Do you need care for your children who are 6-17 years old after school or in the summer?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Rodarte Center

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The After School Program promotes a safe and healthy environment by providing supervised tutoring, homework, reading and computer lab time. Staff that offer tutoring and homework help are comprised mainly of UNC work study students as well as Elementary Education majors from UNC. In collaboration with Weld County School District 6 students are transported from Billie Martinez Elementary School Monday-Friday during the school year. When they arrive at the Rodarte Community Center they must participate in a half hour of homework, tutoring or reading. After this students are programmed in youth enriching activities that varies from day to day. Some agencies that provide programming are Cooking Matters, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts and the High Plains Library District. Each day before the students leave they are provided dinner from the Weld County Food Bank.

Fun In The Sun-The FITS program promotes a safe and healthy environment by providing supervised recreational and educational activities. Participants at Anna Gimmestad Park and the Rodarte Center are engaged in a 10 week program during the summer months Monday-Friday from 1-5 pm for \$25.00. While at these locations they participate in programs such as arts and crafts, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Bookmobile, CSU extensions, swimming and various recreational activities such as dodge ball, basketball, gym games and field activities. In addition to FITS we have Before FITS where participants may pay \$20.00 per week or \$150.00 for the full 10 week session in which they are programmed from 8:30-1:00 pm. These participants are provided a well-balanced breakfast and lunch from the Weld County Food Bank. They are also offered various field trips and activities.

2-1-1 LIVE

QUESTION: Do you have a need to connect to other community services and don't know where to start?

SERVICE PROVIDERS: United Way of Weld County 2-1-1 and Partner Providers

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: 2-1-1 is the largest information and referral service in Colorado. We provide confidential services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in English and Spanish at no cost to the public. United Way 2-1-1 links ALL COLORADO residents to services that strengthen families and improve their economic success; equips them to prepare their children for school; helps them find and keep jobs with opportunities for advancement; helps them identify and gain access to public benefits and subsidies; and increase their access to quality health care.

Guests can be connected to a variety of community services through 2-1-1 Live. Some services will be onsite to offer assistance including:

- A Woman's Place
- Greeley Transitional House
- Envision
- SAVA
- Jobs of Hope
- United Way of Weld County
- U S Senate Offices
- Liberty Tax Preparation

RESTRICTIONS: Some services may require a minimum age of 18 to obtain assistance.

55a. QUESTION: Do you know of someone in an unsafe relationship and would you like to learn more how to help them?

SERVICE PROVIDER: A Woman's Place

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The mission of A Woman's Place is to shelter and help empower victims/survivors of domestic violence to become safe, secure, and self-reliant; through education and collaboration to mobilize our community to help prevent domestic violence. A Woman's Place currently provides the only safe house for domestic violence victims in Weld County. Our agency offers both residential and nonresidential services. Residential services include a safe, self-sufficiency program, advocacy, counseling, legal advocacy, resources, information and referrals. If the victim is not in need of our safe shelter at the time, AWP offers the same services for a nonresident. All of AWP's services are free of cost and confidential. AWP recognizes that violence can affect the entire family, with each family member requiring support and education. AWP offers a 24 hour crisis line for anyone in the community to call. The agency serves individuals from all racial, ethnic, religious, color, gender, age, disability, sexual orientation, or economic status. AWP opposes the use of violence and abuse as means of gaining power and control over others and support equality in intimate relationships. As an agency, we strive to support individuals to assume power over their lives and choose options that afford them a life free of violence, abuse, and oppression.

55b. QUESTION: Would you like information about services for children/adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Envision

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Envision, Creative Support for People with Developmental Disabilities is Weld County's Community Centered Board. This means that Envision provides case management and a diverse set of person-centered services that support more than 1,500 children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities or delays and their families.

In Colorado, a “developmental disability” is defined as a disability that occurs before the person reaches 22 years of age, impairs the person’s general intellectual functioning (IQ of 75 or below), substantially impacts the person’s daily life and significantly limits daily living skills in two or more areas. “Developmental delay” is identified as a 25% or greater delay in one or more developmental domains in children under the age of 5.

Through in-house programs and contracts with a network of provider agencies, individual, professional community businesses and other services, Envision facilitates a comprehensive support program in a broad spectrum of settings, including 24-hour on-site staff, scheduled support staff, host homes and group homes.

Services may include case management, transportation related to services, medication administration and monitoring, ancillary medical care, meal preparation, daily living skills, personal care, access to community services, interpersonal relationships, recreation and leisure activities, group and individual supported employment, adaptive equipment, home modification, and more.

Additionally, Envision Case Managers facilitate access to Early Intervention services for all children birth through age 2 who have a qualifying developmental delay. Early Intervention is provided to the family to enhance the capacity of the family to support their child’s development and learning.

55c. QUESTION: Would you like to learn about services and support available at the Sex Assault Victim's Advocate Center?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Sex Assault Victims Advocate

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: SAVA Center is a non-profit organization dedicated exclusively to the needs of sexual assault survivors in Weld and Larimer Counties. We are the local rape crisis center. We strive to reduce sexual violence and support all those affected by sexual violence.

55d. QUESTION: Is your family either homeless or at risk of homelessness within the next 14 days?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Greeley Transitional House

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Greeley Transitional House is an emergency shelter and transitional housing program providing temporary residential emergency shelter and two-year transitional housing programs for homeless Weld County families. We only serve families and at least one adult in the family must be 18 years old and one adult must be a legal resident.

At Weld Project Connect we will be available as a resource to the 2-1-1 Live Team to provide information, support and referrals as needed. We will not be providing any additional deliverables.

55e. QUESTION: Have you dropped out of high school or have an arrest record and need help finding a job?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Jobs of Hope

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: We assist young men 16-35 who have an arrest record or dropped out of high school with supportive services. We help these men with job training and placement through counseling and mentoring. The most immediate service we would be able to provide potential clients with is brief counseling session with one of the mentors. Potential clients will be able to experience one on one support from someone who has experienced a lifestyle similar to their current one and was able to overcome significant obstacles in order to achieve stability.

55f. QUESTION: Do you want to speak to your U S Senator's representative?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Senator Bennet & Gardner's office field reps

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Office of Senators Bennet & Gardner often can help constituents who need assistance with a federal agency. We have assisted veterans with obtaining records, medical benefits, and disability claims; assisted constituents with Social Security and Medicare benefits; assisted constituents with visa or other immigration issues; and assisted constituents who had issues with a number of federal agencies. Once we discuss your issue with you, we will determine whether we can submit an inquiry, then have you fill out a privacy release form, provide other documents to assist the inquiry, after which we send the inquiry to the federal agency.

55g. QUESTION: Do you need assistance with income taxes or obtaining an ITIN?

SERVICE PROVIDER: Liberty Tax Service

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Liberty Tax Service will help with income tax questions, explain tax notices, and help with ITIN applications.
If we determine that the individual needs tax preparation services we will give the client a certificate for a free tax return.
